Taught in English by leading scholars and practitioners, this two-year program adopts a multi-disciplinary approach to topics such as political development, poverty reduction, non-profit management, and global governance. Eligibility

Applicants must:

Hold an undergraduate degree, preferably in a social science field such as political science, public administration, public policy, international relations, sociology, or economics.

For non-native English speakers, have a minimum TOEFL iBT score of 90 or an IELTS score of 6.0. Applicants whose prior degree was taught entirely in English are exempt from submitting test scores but must provide certification from their institution.

Relevant work and/or volunteer experience is considered an advantage.

Application fee: RMB 600 (non-refundable)
Tuition: RMB 60,000 (for two years)
